Great News from the Past Year

Both of our Odyssey of the Mind teams competed at State. One team won the coveted OMER Award. Our other team took 1st place and will compete at the World Finals this month. This is the 11th consecutive year we have competed at World Finals.

Two students played at Carnegie Hall - 7th grader Edward performed a cello piece in March and 1st grader DJ performed a piano piece in April - both through the American Protégé competitions. In addition, DJ will perform again at Carnegie Hall in June after winning the Golden Era of Romantic Music International Competition.

Over 60 Countryside students and family members participated in the U of I Day of Service – the service project to pack over 149,000 meals for the Eastern Illinois Foodbank at Memorial Stadium.

Countryside swept the Best Presentation category at the U of I Engineering Open House Middle School Design Contest. In addition, 6th grader Jared won Most Unique Design for his vertical axis windmill.

American Legion Post 24 performed a Flag Retirement Ceremony to retire about a dozen flags at our all-school assembly.

Ten Countryside students and alumni danced in Champaign-Urbana Ballet's *The Nutcracker* at Krannert Center.

8th grader Claire won Best in Show at the U of I's Insect Fear Film Festival Art Contest.
Nine of our students received awards!

Director of Teaching & Learning

We are pleased to welcome Minsoo Park into the Countryside community as our new Director of Teaching & Learning. This position was created to address our educational technology needs as well as to help move pedagogical and curricular goals forward. This year we launched a one-to-one iPad initiative in the Middle School as well as adopted Google Apps for Education school wide. In the fall we will be deploying our new learning management system, Alma. We are all excited for the expertise and inspiration that Minsoo brings to Countryside.

Countryside placed 1st in Illinois and 17th in the Nation for Vocabulary Bowl in February.

Countryside placed 2nd at ChessFest 2016. Ten students won trophies or ribbons.

7th grader Zoë competed in IEA Regional horse show in jumping & equitation on the flat.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Poster, Poetry & Prose Contest honored 5th grader Sanaiya and 4th grader Shawn as Top Award Winners for their posters. Fifth grader Benjamin received Special Recognition, and 5th graders Grace, Ryan and 4th grader Charlotte won Honorable Mention.

For the 5th year in a row, several families gathered as Team Countryside to run in the Illinois Marathon 5k.




New Director of Alumni Relations



Roundtables with Alumni

Hannah Gottlieb-Graham, (2008)



Hannah Gottlieb-Graham is a rising senior at Sarah Lawrence College, and studied art history abroad this year at Oxford University. At Sarah Lawrence, she has been passionately and successfully weaving together a career that involves fashion, art, and dance.

At Oxford this year, she furthered her studies of art history through her work with scholar Jane Garnett. Hannah has specifically studied art and gender and contemporary women sculptors, and is currently writing a thesis on Metamorphosis: Titian 2012, a recent collaboration between the National Gallery and the Royal Ballet, in which choreographers and visual artists created ballets and set designs together. Hannah has worked with archivists at the National Gallery and the Royal Ballet, and she spends much time researching and seeing art in London.

She stopped by in September to answer questions from students. Some sage advice from Hannah: be as assertive as possible with finding what you want to do; big cities take some getting used to - don't give up right away; and trust your gut and follow your instincts. She says at Countryside she learned to love learning and greatly appreciates the "out of the chair" creative environment that fostered her imagination.

Q&A with Alumni


Daniel Borup, Class of 2005

At Stanford, I'm studying experimental fluid mechanics. My thesis topic is the development of a method for measuring particle concentration in turbulent flows using MRI (magnetic resonance imaging). The initial motivation for the project was the study of dust sucked into aircraft engines, but potential applications are wide-ranging and include inhalation of particles into the human airway or sediment transport in river or ocean flows.

After graduating I'm not sure what I'd like to do yet. It's a tough decision between academia (post-doc and then a professorship) or going into industry--either research for a big company or something more entrepreneurial, if that option presents itself. All of those are intriguing options with their own benefits and possible drawbacks, so it's certainly not an easy decision! However, I still have around three years remaining to decide.

As far as Countryside goes, I have a number of great memories. I met my closest group of

friends in middle school at Countryside and still visit them every time I'm in the Midwest. I'm also pretty involved in choral and solo singing these days, so I certainly have



strong memories of the various P.E. shows and musicals we put on over the years. The fun group atmosphere of those shows, plus things like chess club and the basketball and soccer teams were great. My friends and I have so many fun stories from those years that make for great reminiscing.

As far as things I still use, the mathematical foundations I learned at Countryside are absolutely important for me every day as I needed those to build up enough mathematical knowledge for advanced study

in engineering. I use algebra many, many times per day on most days. More generally, I find that I still greatly enjoy learning about all sorts of things, and I'm sure having a challenging and rewarding school experience is a big part of why I've become a life-long learner.
